FLOC 2021 Read-a-Thon How to Use TumbleBookLibrary

What is TumbleBookLibrary?

TumbleBookLibrary is a curated database of children’s e-books. It has over 1,100 titles for grades K-6, and includes unique talking picture books, read-along chapter books, National Geographic videos, non-fiction books, playlists, as well as books in Spanish and French. Plus, the collection features Graphic Novels – a student favorite!

What do I need to access TumbleBookLibrary?

Anyone with a D.C. Public Library Card and an internet-connected device (laptop, computer, tablet, or phone) can access TumbleBookLibrary.

How to access TumbleBookLibrary:

- 1) Visit <https://www.dclibrary.org/tumblebooks>
- 2) Click the purple “Visit” button.
- 3) Enter your DCPL Card number (found on the back of your library card underneath the barcode) to enter the site.

How to use TumbleBookLibrary:

- Use the tabs at the top of the site to select from these categories:
 - **Story Books** - children’s books with animated visuals and audio of the book being read aloud
 - **Read Alongs** - longer books for older students to practice reading to themselves or out loud
 - **E-Books** - chapter books that can be read in their entirety online
 - **Graphic Novels** - entire graphic novels available to be read online
 - **Non-Fiction** - non-fiction texts available online for all ages
 - **Videos** - educational videos on a variety of topics
 - **Language Learning** - texts in Spanish and French
 - **Playlists** - pre-selected lists of TumbleBook texts, sorted by length or subject
 - **Puzzles & Games** - interactive educational literacy activities
